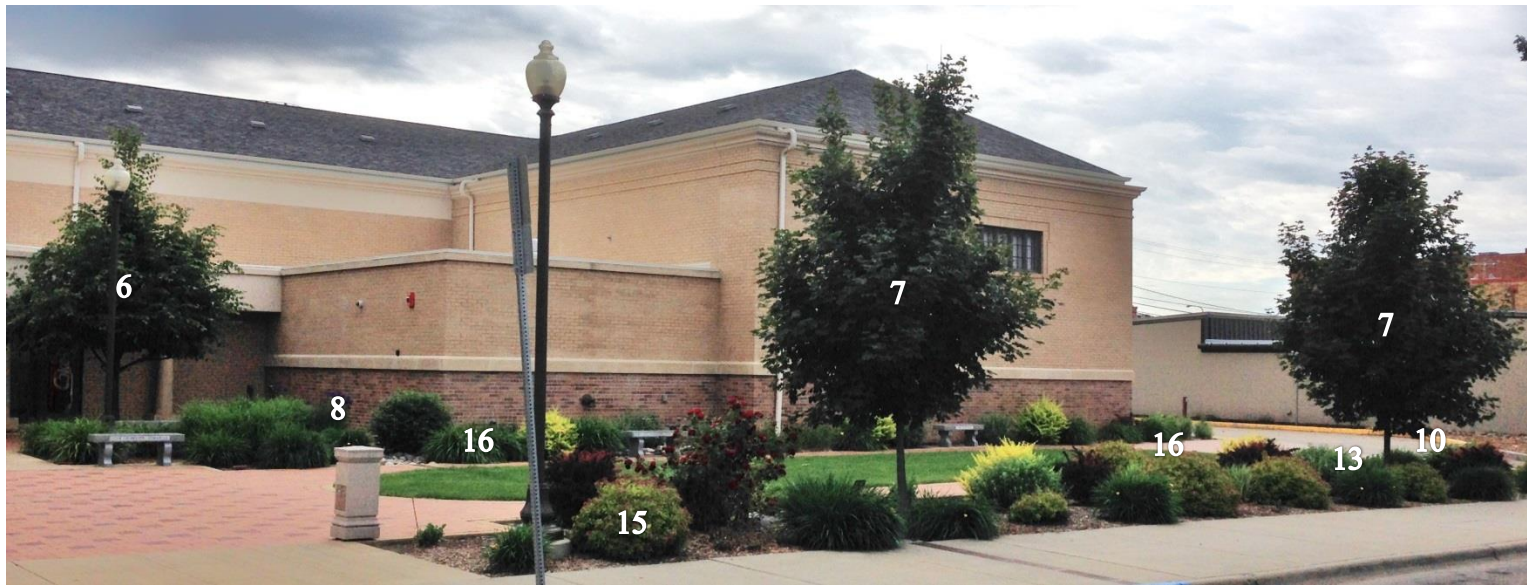




*To make the best use of this guide, please visit the Library. While plant locations are shown, detailed pictures of the plants are not - so a visit or consulting a reference book are needed. Only a representative sample of plants are identified; other plants identical to these should be obvious.*



## Plants used:

1. **Dwarf Korean Lilac** – *Syringa meyeri*  
4-5'T 5-7'W; full sun; blooms in early summer; OK as hedge

**Japanese Barberry** – *Berberis thunbergii*

2. 'Golden Carousel' 4-5'T 3-4'W; full sun

3. 'Rosy Glow 3-4'T 3-4'W; full sun to part shade both OK as hedge

4. **Ninebark** – *Physocarpus opulifolius* 'Diablo'  
8-10'T 8-10'W; full sun to part shade (behind Dwarf Korean Lilac)

5. **American Linden** – *Tilia Americana*  
40-90'T 25-50"W

6. **Littleleaf Linden** – *Tilia cordata*  
30-75'T 15-40'W; also called **Basswood**

7. **Deborah Maple** – *Acer platanoides* 'Deborah'  
15-20T 15-20W; full sun to part shade

8. **Siberian Iris** – *Iris sibirica*  
3'T; full sun to part shade; blooms in spring-early summer

9. **Daylilies** – *Hemerocallis spp.*  
10-30"T; full sun to part shade; many varieties and colors and bloom times are available

10. **Sedum** – *Sedum 'Autumn Joy'*  
2'T; full sun

11. **Dwarf Burning Bush** – *Euonymus alatus* 'Compacta'  
5-6'T 5-8W; full sun to part shade; OK as hedge; noted for spectacular fall color (red)

12. **Common Lilac** – *Syringa vulgaris*  
12-15'T 8-12W; full sun; blooms spring-early summer

13. **Russian Sage** – *Perovskia atriplicifolia*  
4'T; full sun; blooms late summer (look behind benches, too!)

14. **Shrub Rose** – *Rosa 'Hope for Humanity'*  
2-4'T; a Canadian-developed Parkland Rose; blooms throughout season

15. **Spirea** – *Spirea japonica*  
2-3'T; full sun to part shade; leaf colors are green, gold, and red in many varieties; 'Gold Mound' is used here

16. **Grasses** – various 3-4'T

- **Feather Reed** *Calamagrostis acutiflora* 'Karl Foerster' and 'Avalanche'
- **Flame** *Miscanthus sinensis* 'Purpurascens'

17. **Wood's Pink Aster** – *Aster divericatus*  
8-16"T 12-24"W; full sun; blooms Aug. to Oct.
